## **Oregon Home Care Commission meets Feb. 4 and 5**

Agenda items for the full commission include public testimony (10:15 a.m.), budget update (10:20 a.m.), HUBB update (10:30 a.m.), NIOSH grant (10:50 a.m.), STEPS update (11:10 a.m.), training update (11:25 a.m.), registry update (11:45 a.m.), executive session (12 – 1 p.m.), workers' compensation update (1 p.m.), and executive director's report (1:20 p.m.). The Commission will hold an executive session [ORS 192.610-192.710] to discuss labor negotiations with the governing body's representative [ORS 192.660(1)(d)].

The commission is responsible for ensuring the quality of publicly funded in-home care services. The commission has three major charges: (1) to define qualifications of homecare workers; (2) to create a statewide registry of homecare workers; and (3) to provide training opportunities for homecare workers. Beyond these responsibilities, the Home Care Commission is also the "employer of record" for purposes of collective bargaining for homecare workers whose pay comes from public funds.
